Are you united to every person at Immanuel Bible Church? You may be wondering, "What do you mean by united?" I don't mean do you eat meals with church friends or do your kids play together or do you live in the same neighborhood as church members. What I am asking is if you are currently living out the prayer of Jesus right here in our church. Listen to how Jesus prays at the end of the High Priestly Prayer.

"I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word." (Jn 17:20) Jesus had just prayed for Himself, that His life, death, resurrection, and ascension would bring glory to the Father (Jn 17:1-5). He went on in verses 6-19 to pray for the disciples who were sitting right by His side that very night before His death. He prayed for their preservation in the upcoming trial of His death and the coming persecution that was sure to follow His resurrection and their commissioning to the ends of the earth. He also prayed that the Father would make them holy "in the truth," clarifying that "your word is truth." (Jn 17:17) Now Jesus ends his prayer by praying for future believers. That's you and me. That's Immanuel Bible Church. And what is it that He prays?

Jesus prays that future believers "may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me... I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me." (Jn 17:21, 23) Jesus, the perfect Son of God, whose prayers the Father not only hears, but assuredly

answers, asked that you would be "one" with the Christians you stand next to every single Sunday. Not only that, but Jesus asked that you would be "perfectly one" with them. I'd like to make three observations about this unity that should urge us to actively live out this prayer of Jesus at Immanuel Bible Church.

Firstly, this oneness that Jesus prays for us is modeled after the oneness of the Trinity. While there are countless ways in which we are not like the perfect, eternally loving, unified Godhead, Jesus is making the point that our being united to one another flows out of God's very nature as a Tri-unity. The Father, The Son, and the Spirit have lived in eternal love and unbroken unity forever. There has never been a time that the Triune God was not pure life. And because this Triune God has prayed for us and given us this eternal life, our new life is like His. It is a life of love and unity. And this unity is firstly with God Himself and secondly, as Jesus prayed, it's with one another. This is why the two greatest commands are to love God and love your neighbor: this is the very order of our life in Christ.

Secondly, in answer to the question we began with, you are objectively united to every Christian at Immanuel Bible Church. That unity is a fact as sure as the very life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, the One who unites us by His Spirit. But here's the challenge for us. Jesus is praying for our unity. The New Testament is filled with commands to be unified. Jesus urged His disciples to love one another. The second observation here is that our objective unity needs to be actively realized through our daily obedience. Jesus' prayer is telling you this: "Your lack of unity with another Christian at Immanuel Bible Church is a subjective lie because you are objectively unified to that person by Christ. Therefore, be reconciled and united to those you are already objectively united to by Christ." I cannot promise that reconciliation is easy, but the Bible guarantees that if someone is truly a Christian, that Jesus prayed for and provided that very unity through the Gospel.

Lastly, did you hear the "so that" of Jesus' prayer for our unity? Our unity is not even about us ultimately. Jesus prayed that we would be unified just as the Godhead "so that the world may believe that you have sent me... so that the world may know that you sent me..." (Jn 17:21, 23) If your unbelieving neighbors and family and friends are under the impression that you are a follower of Jesus but your life is characterized by disunity, you are being a bad witness to the unifying love of God. Our unity is meant to show off the love of Jesus to a watching world (Jn 13:35) Don't be fooled, the world is watching Immanuel Bible Church to see how we live. Live out the unity that is already yours today in Christ and you will find yourself walking in the good works "which God prepared beforehand that you should walk in them." Or, to put it like John 17 would, walk in the good works that Jesus prayed for you to walk in.
